this medieval fortress is famous as a place of imprisonment and death but has also been used as a royal residence, an armoury, a mint, a menagerie, an observatory & a place for safe keeping

the Royal Armouries collection in the White Tower records the history of armour and arms with examples including cannon and mortar. . A 'Line of Kings' shows 17th century life-size portraits of kings dressed either in personal attire or in armour. Please note that the main collection of armour is now kept in Leeds, Yorkshire with other pieces at Fort Nelson, Portsmouth, Hampshire

Tower Hill, EC3

unveiled in 2000, reproductions of oil paintings by Stephen B Whatley decorate the passageway from Tower Hill underground station to the Tower of London. They tell the story of the Tower and the people and events associated with it - kings and queens, collections of arms and armour, the Crown Jewels, the historic buildings, the Warden Beefeaters and the ravens

Emperor Trajan

an 18th century Italian statue of the Roman Emperor Trajan (98-117) shows him in armour holding a weapon and a scroll. Trajan had no connection with the Tower Hill area - the statue was found in a scrapyard and presented to the Tower Hill Improvement Trust in 1980

the costumes section outlines the process of designing, making & fitting Shakesperean costumes. Visitors can feel fabrics and try on armour

this collection is considered one of the best in the world for French 18th century paintings, porcelain and furniture but it also includes some examples of European, Oriental, Renaissance and equestrian armour

of special interest is the Greenwich Field Armour of Lord Buckhurst. Made in the 16th century it is a full suit with peascod breastplate and thigh defences (tassets) specially shaped for the puffed trunk hose of the period. It could be used either on foot or on horse, pieces being added as necessary

Charles I

the armoured statue of King Charles I has the date '1632' engraved on the horse's left front foot. The figure, sculptured by Hubert Le Sueur, stands on a pedestal designed by

Christopher Wren and carved by Grinling Gibbons. It has stood on the present site since 1675 and was given a new sword in 1947. The original armour is now in the Tower of London

a 10ft high monument to Sir Hugo Hammersley (d.1636) shows him in armour. His wife and two mourning soldiers are behind him

among the art collection in this world-renowned gallery is a 1637 painting by Anthony Van Dyke (1599-1641) showing King Charles I on his horse dressed in armour and wearing the medallion of the Garter Sovereign

among the naval portraits of this collection is one showing King James II in gold & orange Roman-style armour

Southwark War Memorial

this war memorial commemorates the men of St Saviours, Southwark who gave their lives for the Empire during the 1914-18 War. It has the bronze figure of a soldier with tin hat and rifle marching through mud, figures of a knight in armour and a weeping woman & child. One bronze panel shows battleships and the other biplanes in aerial combat

among the collection of Celtic bronzeware are wine flacons, armour and mirrors
in 1939 a 30ft (9m) oak Saxon burial ship was excavated in Suffolk. On board was found what is now known as the Sutton Hoo Treasure - . 41 items of solid gold including jewellery, silver objects including bowls, weapons, coins, cups and armour dating from between 575 and 620

Achilles

Hyde Park, on the ring road from Hyde Park Corner to Marble Arch, W1

this nude bronze statue by Sir Richard Westmacott, was erected in 1822 as a memorial to Wellington. It holds a shield and sword and stands next to a suit of armour . Although called Achilles it is in fact not Achilles nor does it have the face of Wellington. Cast from cannon captured at the Peninsular War it stands 18ft (5 m) high, weighs 33 tons and is the copy of a Roman horse trainer

in the Grand Vestibule are patterned displays or trophies, arms and armour including armour seized from Tipoo, Sultan of Mysore, in 1799. A suit of a Royal Champion is in St George's Hall including the last suit made for King Henry VIII. Examples of equestrian armour can also be seen - they show how a man on horseback would have looked going into battle
