this world famous natural history museum houses the National Collection of British and Irish Lepidoptera. With over half a million specimens housed in 5000 drawers it is the most important collection in existence. It is housed in the Department of Entomology and can be viewed by special appointment

another collection (Rothschild-Cockayne-Kettlewell) has 2000 drawers of British and Irish butterflies and moths arranged so as to show the many forms of variation
